Be it teaching braille to visually impaired children or distributing blankets in Africa, the warmth of Sai love touches hearts

and India have distributed mosquito nets impregnated with insecticide in malaria endemic areas. In Kenya alone, over 85,000 nets have been distributed, reducing the incidence of malaria by more than 50%. Also, mass immunisation, environmental hygiene and education in healthy living through lifestyle changes are an integral part of such preventive health programs.

Service to Man is Service to God Sai volunteers across the world participate in

a variety of community service projects and disaster relief work. They serve homeless shelters, soup kitchens and food banks at the community level. Clothing, blankets, toiletries, school supplies and groceries are also provided for needy families. Frequent visits to hospitals, elderly homes, orphanages and prisons are regular outreach activities of Sai Centres internationally.

Disaster Relief

In the wake of disasters, such as Hurricane Katrina and the Tsunami of 2004, the volunteers of the Sai Organisation are often among the first to arrive and offer help to the afflicted.

Sai volunteers worked round the clock to provide relief and rehabilitation to the victims of the massive earthquake that struck the Republic of Haiti on 12th January 2010. Between 19th January and August 2010, under the guidance of Baba, they provided free medical treatment to over 34,000 people, served more than 150,000 hot meals, supplied thousands of gallons of potable water, built homes and cleaned roadways for Haitians. The work that began seven days after the earthquake in the midst of widespread destruction continues to this day with discipline, determination and dedication that has become the hallmark of Sai volunteers.

At the invitation of the Myanmar government, the Sathya Sai Baba Central Council of Malaysia, along with volunteers from Singapore and Thailand, undertook the monumental task of building a village with 51 new homes, a temple and a school, for the victims of the tropical storm 'Nargis' that hit the Ayerawaddy Delta region of the capital city of Yangon. This village was later christened as the Sri Sathya Sai Baba Village and inaugurated on 21st December 2008.

The devastating Indian Ocean tsunami in 2004 killed approximately 230,000 people in 14 countries. Sai Organisation rushed immediate relief to victims in Thailand, Indonesia, Sri Lanka and Malaysia, providing medical aid, drinking water, groceries and cooked food to the afflicted.

Three mosques, 108 houses, and four large water tanks were also built in Jogjakarta, Indonesia. The Sai Organisation of Malaysia received the prestigious Malaysian Humanitarian Award in 2006 for its timely and large-scale relief work.

he Sai Mobile Hospital is a unique and free rural outreach holistic health service launched on March 30th 2006 by Bhagavan Baba. A unit of the SSS Medical Trust, it operates from the 1st to 12th of every month at 12 base villages to each of which are attached another 6 villages. In practice however, patients are drawn from nearly 400 villages.

The hospital-on-wheels is managed almost entirely on voluntary basis. Five hundred doctors from the state of Andhra Pradesh belonging to 12 specialties serve in rotation. This diagnostic bus comes equipped with an ultra sonogram, x-ray plant with automatic processor and a laboratory which can perform most of the pathological and bio-chemical investigations.

Given the program's outreach, its larger agenda is based on a triangular approach of Curative thrust, Preventive focus and Spiritual base.

The curative thrust owes its



strength to the presence of specialists belonging to Radiology, Medicine, Surgery, Orthopedics, ENT, Dentistry, Ophthalmology, Gynecology & Pediatrics on any given day. They work under a common roof integrating their efforts to solve many an intricate problem. Six hundred to seven hundred patients are seen every day at each of the nodal points.

The curative work is further strengthened by a strong pharmacy which ensures that patients with chronic ailments like epilepsy, diabetes, hypertension, heart disease and asthma are provided with continuous and uninterrupted supply of medicines (one month's worth till the next visit).

Patients requiring follow-up treatment like surgical intervention are referred to Baba's Super Speciality hospitals and their problems are monitored till the logical solutions are arrived.

On the diagnostic front, for the few tests that cannot be undertaken on the bus, the team has an innovative system in place. Samples are collected and delivered to the SSS Super Specialty



Bhagavan Baba recently directed that the beneficiaries of the Mobile Hospital should also be provided nutritious meals. Food prepared at Prashanti Nilayam is served to the patients and other undernourished villagers by the volunteers. This ongoing program will serve several thousand villagers daily, satiating their hunger alongside providing healthcare.

Hospital for testing and reporting. The preventive work consists

of health education based on five major themes: cleanliness, nutrition, healthy air and water, harmful effects of smoking and alcoholism, proper physical exercise and mind relaxation.

Education on these subjects is

offered through audiovisual presentations, demonstrative sessions, interactive meets and photo exhibition. It is further reinforced by regular screening through the local cable television.

The spiritual base of the service involves educating and motivating the villagers on the importance of positive thinking, human values and age-old practices like prayer and meditation all of which foster positive health.

With this holistic strategy, ninety percent of community's health problems are solved because the approach is professional, proactive and integrated and takes care of common ailments, chronic ailments, preventive ailments, asymptomatic diseases and endemic diseases. Only problems requiring major surgical intervention are referred to the base hospitals.

The impact of the service is tremendous. On the curative front it has given a sense of great security to people living in hundreds of villages around Puttaparthi. It is a boon for patients with chronic ailments who can never dream of buying medicines on a continuous


basis. The preventive services have created a huge wave of awareness on major health issues, thereby translating into positive lifestyle changes. The spiritual component of the service has strengthened the community bonds, reviving the practice of human values as a way of life for achieving health and happiness.

Inspired by Bhagavan Baba's call to fulfill their social responsibility through selfless service, medical professionals including doctors, paramedics, lab technicians and pharmacists are seizing this opportunity to express their gratitude to society, which nourishes and nurtures them.

The success of this project has triggered a domino's effect in other states such as Maharashtra where a fleet of 29 such hospitals on wheels are being deployed by the Sai Organisation to serve six hundred thousand villagers in the interiors of Maharashtra.

The Sai Mobile Hospitals bring to rural India not only a state-ofthe-art healthcare but also a state-of-the-heart caring and loving services.





a resolution to recognise access to clean water and sanitation as a human right. Even as countries set about to achieve the goals, there is a sustainable model that has been functioning successfully in South India.

The Sai Water Project in East and West Godavari Districts of Andhra Pradesh was followed by medical camps for tribals in the hamlets that had remained untouched by modern civilisation and isolated from the rest

of the world. Soon it expanded to provide medical, social, economic and holistic benefits as well. The project not only delivered drinking water but also proved that human beings can be motivated to action as much by values as by economic benefits. These initiatives were the precursors to Baba's announcement of the Sri Sathya Sai Village Integrated Programme (SSSVIP) on March 20, 2007. Immediately the 25 hamlets in East Godavari District, which were already receiving drinking water supply from the Sai Project, were selected for a pilot project.



The SSSVIP addressed the holistic needs of each villager, nurturing the family unit as the foundation. The eight







SSS Village intergrated programme empowers each villager to take responsibility for individual and collective well-being

main components of the SSSVIP are: infrastructure, employment, education, medical and health, social, spiritual and individual care.

Within a span of three years, the SSSVIP has extended to 1,300 villages across India and continues to grow. What is common among these villages is that essentials such as hospitals, schools, industries, banks or even post offices are beyond reach, majority of the population lives below the poverty line, and several of the government's welfare schemes have not touched these areas. Once a specific village is identified, a basic survey is conducted to assess the common and individual needs and the components are prioritised accordingly.

"An important aspect of the SSSVIP is counseling and emotional support. It may not be possible to solve all their problems, but the volunteers listen to the residents and provide emotional support, as well as counsel them. The emphasis is not just on material resources, but also on the healing power of love without proselytising," explains Mr. V.Srinivasan, the All India President of the SSS Seva Organisation.

In line with Baba's Universalism, the program does not discriminate between the beneficiaries on religious, caste, community or socio-economic grounds. Further, "It empowers the villagers to get involved," says Dr. Ram Manohar, the SSSVIP's National Coordinator.

Showing the way

Testimonials of the program's success are many. Nine-year old Vignesh waves his thin arms in excitement and struggles to stand up and welcome the guests to his two-room house at Maagaral village in Tamil Nadu.

Vignesh was a healthy child till he was seven months old. Constant epileptic seizures and lack of medical attention rendered him physically and

speech disabled. Vignesh now has a new found hope in a pair of new calipers and the encouragement to walk daily with support. Volunteers of the Sa organisation talk and play with him or their visits to the village. They also chaperone his mother to his physiotherapy that has been arranged in Chennai.

Elderly Yagatha of the same village was malnourished and living alone She is now a beneficiary of "Amirtha Kalasam" program, which ensures her monthly groceries and toiletries. In the Kanchipuram district of Tamil Nadu the SSSVIP addressed nutritional and ecological concerns by planting thousands of drum sticks, papaya and curry leaf saplings for 700 families.

Earlier on in 2004, the Sai volunteers of UP and Uttarakhand successfully implemented a hydro-electric project at Pokhari, a village with 50 households in the Gharwal Hills. With technical inputs from IIT Kanpur, the project generates 5000 watts power from a small river.

In East Godavari District, the tribals had adopted shift cultivation, cutting down the forest trees to grow their produce. Food was scarce. Villagers. including children were consuming toddy to overcome hunger. The Sa sevadals provided seeds to raise kitcher gardens, taught the children to bathe daily, clip their nails and comb the hair They worked with the teachers in the nearby school and organised medical camps. Now, the children in the 25 hamlets are completely free from alcoholism and at least 50 per cent of the women no longer consume toddy. The Government has been motivated to lay roads to all the hamlets which few knew existed prior to the Sai Water Project.

As the world approaches the 2015 deadline for achieving the Millenium Development Goals, India has proven that SSSVIP is a viable model that builds trust and confidence, motivating people and authorities towards public participation and shared responsibility for the goal of community development.
